## Bridge Club of North County

Our new series of classes for beginning bridge players starts Saturday, October $13^{\text {th }}$ at 9:00 AM. The first offering is Bridge Basics 1.These classes are based on proven teaching methods developed by Audrey Grant, a widely acclaimed bridge expert. Beginning with the basics, this course is the perfect introduction to bridge. It progresses through modern bidding, no trump openings and responses, and both major suit and minor suit opening bids and responses. Following these lessons, you will put what you have learned into practice with a series of games, all monitored by your teacher. The cost is $\$ 99$ for the eight sessions and includes Audrey Grant's Bridge Basics 1 book. Graduates of our recent instruction courses are finding the new $\mathbf{0 - 2 0}$ introductory game on Wednesday mornings to be the perfect follow-on to practice what they have learned in a no pressure, relaxed environment. This game has a mentor available to answer questions and monitor the play. It is not required that you have attended BCNC classes to play in this game - only that you are familiar with the basic bridge game and you hold no more than 20 masterpoints. For this particular game you don't need to arrive with a partner. You can just come - we'll arrange a partner for you. On Wednesday mornings we also have a $0-150$ game. This game has been growing over the last few months and has become a regular habit for many players in this MP range. It's a low key, friendly game for mid-range learners/players.

Workshops: Our weekly bridge workshops will start up again on Thursday, October 11th, at 1:00 p.m. The schedule and topics for this next series of 8 sessions is as follows: October $11^{\text {th }}$, Making a Plan; October $18^{\text {th }}$, Developing Tricks - Promotion \& Length; October $25^{\text {th }}$, Developing Tricks - The Finesse; November 1, Eliminating Losers - Ruffing and Discarding; November $8^{\text {th }}$, Watching Out for Entries; November $15^{\text {th }}$, Watching Out for the Opponents; November 22 ${ }^{\text {nd }}$, No workshopThanksgiving Day; November $29^{\text {th }}$, Managing the Trump Suit; and December $6^{\text {th }}$, Putting It All Together. The fee is $\$ 5$ per session. No sign-up is required. You don't need to be enrolled in any class to participate in the workshops, and you can come whenever a topic is of interest to you. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to email Hazel at hazelturnerbridge@gmail.com
Mentoring: Gaining in popularity are the mentoring sessions being offered every Monday and Tuesday morning at 9:00 AM. Intended for beginning and intermediate levels of expertise, players are organized by table according to individual skill level. The players bid and play hands which are then discussed with the mentor who critiques the hand, and provides alternative strategies on bidding, play of the hand, and defense. Sessions last about $21 / 2$ hours. The cost is $\$ 5$ and players are invited to stay and play in the afternoon game for an additional $\$ 6$. To participate in the mentoring sessions, you must sign up in advance. This is required so that enough qualified mentors can be enlisted to assist each table of players.
