

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I just got back from a visit to Montana, where just like here, the winter has been unusually wet and cold. The difference is that unusually wet means lots of snow, and unusually cold means really cold. One of the other big differences I noticed between here and there is the size of the parking spaces. Unlike here where you have to squeeze in as many parking spaces as possible, they actually have parking spots where you can open your car door without hitting the car next to you.

Those pesky little parking spots that we have here have an oversized influence on duplicate bridge. We just had a successful Winter Sectional at the Women's Club of Escondido. The space and the parking worked really well, and we actually made a little money. I recently called the Women's Club to book the space for next year, and they said "no". When I asked why "no", I was told that we used more parking spaces than they expected, and that disrupted a church event at the church they share parking with. So we are in search of a new site for next year. Have a suggestion? Please share it with me.

If you haven't heard, Adventures in Bridge has lost its lease and is closed for at least a month. One of the major reasons for Wirt losing his lease is parking. When 120 people show up to play bridge, 120 cars show up with them, and this is a major problem for the businesses that share parking space with the bridge clubs. To the best of my knowledge, Wirt hasn't found a site yet that will accommodate both his space and parking needs.

The Redwood Bridge Club, which is based in Balboa Park, will close temporarily starting in May while their clubhouse is being remodeled. If Wirt hasn't found new a spot, and Redwood is closed, there will be a dramatic change in where duplicate bridge is played here in San Diego this summer, which brings me back to parking. With the construction that is taking place behind the BCNC, street parking will become more of a challenge. Please be patient.
