## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our unit is part of ACBL District 22, and David Lodge is our representative to the Board of Directors. After each Board meeting, he usually sends the unit presidents a summary of the meeting. His last summary sort of caught my attention when he started it with the following: "One of the realities of life is that a great deal of time of the BOD is spent on high level tournament play. Such was the case in Memphis where much of the BOD activities centered around cheating at the national (international level)."

Call me naive, call me unrealistic, call me out of touch, call me whatever, I have a hard time getting my head around the fact that there is a lot of cheating in duplicate bridge. It sort of takes away the aura surrounding those people playing behind the curtain at these big tournaments. When I read in the Bridge Bulletin about the really clever bidding sequence that took place for the winning hand at the national tournament, it sort of makes me wonder if it was really that clever.

In the same vein, a Washington Post headline on March 1st read: "Doping scandal rocks the world of ... bridge?". The World Bridge Federation regularly drug tests participants in their big tournament games and imposes penalties on those who fail the test. Amazingly it was reported that 22% of those tested test positive for a banned substance. In this particular case Geir Helgemo, a Norwegian-born player who plays for the Monaco team, was suspended for a year for doping with a synthetic testosterone.

Back to bridge here at home: our unit is number one in the district for adding new members to the ACBL. This is in large part due to the great work Hazel and others are doing with the beginner bridge program. I ran into Wirt at the Regional, and he is still struggling to find a place with adequate parking. So it appears Adventures in Bridge won't be reopening for a while.

## Unit 549 Club News Bridge Club of North County

Are you a "bridge thief"? What's that, you ask? If you regularly take longer than the time allowed to finish the hands in a round, you are a bridge thief. It means you "steal" time from your fellow players who come to the table after you, by limiting the amount of time they have to finish the next round on time. The clock does not reset for them when you take too long to finish. This gives you an unfair advantage. Bridge is a timed event. Thinking and acting quickly is part of the skill. Did you know the BCNC has a Club Policy regarding "slow play"? It's in Section 4.3.5 of the Club Handbook. There are two statements in this section you should be cognizant of: 1) Slow play, especially habitual slow play, is a violation of law and subject to penalty. And 2) If the opening lead is not on the table when the round is called (by the director OR the clock) the hand should not be played and a No Play should be issued. The Club Policy is posted on the Club News bulleting board. There is also an article from ACBL about this subject on the Bridge News bulletin board. There is really no excuse for habitual slow play and the penalties given are well earned when slow play pairs disrupt the normal progression of the game.

The Community Corner bulletin board is becoming more and more the place to hang out while you wait for your table to be available or you just have some time to kill. There are lots of good recommendations for local tradespeople, some interesting doings of our club members, and even some funny stuff! By the way, you are all invited to post things there. Anything you might want to share, so long as it's "clean", and not commercial advertising. If you post a recommendation, please put your name on the notice so anyone who's interested could talk to you about it. You can list requests for partnerships there as well.

Don't forget to turn in your recommendation chit for **"Player of the Month".** If you know someone who is delightful to have at a bridge table, who always makes you feel welcome and appreciated, who you think is a great partner (maybe not yours, but anyone's), fill out one of those yellow slips and get your friends to do the same. Lobby for that person. Make it happen!

We're still calling for volunteers! Here's an easy, not too timeconsuming task for someone...Lost & Found Monitor. This job is really simple! You just need to monitor the items left behind at the club, attach a ticket with the date it was left, and hang it up on the Lost & Found pegs. Periodically, you check the dates on the ticketed items, and when something has been hanging for 3 months, you donate it to a charity TBD. That's it – easy peasy!
