The Board would like to thank all of you who made our Holiday Toy Drive an incredible, almost beyond the imagination success. Rabbi Jonathan Sacks said, "Happiness is not made by what we own. Anyone planning to attend or thinking of attending should get their registration in as soon as possible.

There will be no unit game next month. Our next unit game will be on February 22nd.

So, here's wishing your new year is filled with good health and happy exploration, discovery, and growth - especially as it refers to bridge! We look forward to seeing you practicing your new skills at our tables for another great year of unit games.

I hope all you NLM players have scheduled yourselves to play in Unit 549's "once in a life-time" NLM Regional/ Winter Sectional. That's right — once! We have learned that ACBL has decided that only Districts can sponsor Regionals from now on, so our event will truly be a one-time thing. AND, it's coming up fast...on January 10th and 11th. Every non-life master in San Diego County should take advantage of this remarkable opportunity to win GOLD points right here at home. If you haven't already got it scheduled, get a move on. Let us know if you need a partner and we'll try to help you find one. Go to our website at *acblunit549.org* and click on Partnerships.

Attention Open players: this is a <u>combo event</u>, which means that our Winter Sectional will run concurrently – in the same location as the NLM Regional. It will be held at St. Gabriel's Catholic Church Auditorium, 13734 Twin Peaks Road, Poway, CA 92064. There will be two sessions for each event both days of the tournament.

The NLM Regional will offer 0-750 "Gold Rush" 2-session games and single session side games (all stratified C: 0-200, B:200-500, A:500-750).

The Sectional (for silver points) will also offer 2 sessions per day, again with no requirement to play in both sessions each day. In addition to the Open Section (C:0-2000, B:2000-4000, A:4000 +), there will be a 0-1500 Section (C:0-500, B:500-1000, A:1000-1500).

Games will start at 10 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Entry fee for each session is \$13. Lunch will be available for purchase at \$7. Players with 0-20 MPS play free! Additional information and directions to St. Gabriel's is available on the event flyer posted on our website at acblunit549.org

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I'm not a wine connoisseur but for some reason fine wine always has some year associated with it. Well, in the case of duplicate bridge in North County, 2019 will be one of those years. The state of our unit and the state of our clubs has never been better in the 8 years I've been a member. And all of this is due to a lot of selfless volunteers who just step up and make good things happen.

Our club in Ramona keeps building on it's successes and is providing some real good bridge opportunities for our members up in the hills. They acquired a dealing machine which has made getting ready for those games that much easier and they have a solid core of volunteers. San Marcos is steady as you go. They provide a Wednesday game for players on the coast and an alternative for the inland players. They saw an almost 20% increase in their table count from 2018.

Our crown jewel of course is the Bridge Club of North County. Their table count grew by 17% over 2018 and they are now the 13th largest bridge club in California. But the most important thing they have done is to work hard to foster and grow duplicate bridge. Their mentoring program provided over 260 tables of mentored bridge. They maintained a strong program of beginning bridge lessons with some really amazing results. They offered Bridge Basics 1, 2 & 3 and a 2 over 1 class to a total of 213 registered students. These efforts resulted in 25 new ACBL members. For the more advanced players they offered defense workshops and had 164 attendees.

The unit itself had another really good year. Our Winter Sectional was a success with a table count increase from the previous year and a small profit to show for our efforts. The Audrey Grant seminar was a roaring success with a record turn out. We had attendees who traveled over 120 miles for the event and were glad they did. Our unit games table count is up significantly and we are now averaging about 30 tables each month. The really positive part of that number is we are averaging more than 12 non-life master tables each month.

The Board would like to thank all of our members and all of you who play bridge here in North County for our success in 2019. It is going to be a hard act to follow but based on our January start we might actually do it.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings from someone who never heard of or even conceptualized of a term like "social distancing".
